Founded in Montreal in 2002 by Victor Quijada, RUBBERBAND quickly captivated audiences and critics with three creations presented at Espace Tangente over two seasons. At the same time, the company participates in mixed programs and organizes events in various venues in Montreal that highlight more confidential pieces. Tender Loving Care and Hasta la Próxima share a place in Le Devoir's top five dance productions, while Elastic Perspective begins a series of over 100 performances in 2003 after winning the Prix RIDEAU at the Festival Vue sur la Relève. RUBBERBAND then obtained a residency at Usine C for the 2003-2004 season, where the piece Slicing Static was born. This creation was named Best Dance Production in 2004 by Hour (now Cult MTL).

In 2005, **Anne Plamondon** joined Victor Quijada as Artistic Director. A second residency at Usine C was granted to the company in 2006, followed by another four-year residency at **Place des Arts**. During this period, four new pieces were created with the support of multiple partners: **Punto Ciego** and **AV Input/Output** in 2008, **Loan Sharking** in 2009 and **Gravity of Center** in 2011.

In 2013, Quijada created *Empiric Quotient*, a show for six performers trained in the **RUBBERBAND Method**. In 2016, the company created *Vic's Mix*, a condensed version of the best moments of the choreographer's work. During the festivities for the 375th anniversary of Montreal (2017), the members of the company were joined by some thirty students from the École supérieure de ballet du Québec and the École de danse contemporaine de Montréal to take over the Esplanade de la Place des Arts with the multidisciplinary performance *City Thread*.

In 2018, for the first time in RUBBERBAND, Victor Quijada called upon a large ensemble by directing ten dancers on the huge stage of **Théâtre Maisonneuve** at **Place des Arts** with **Ever So Slightly**, presented by **Danse Danse**. In 2019, RUBBERBAND is a **finalist for the Grand Prix du Conseil des arts de Montréal** for its production **Ever So Slightly**.

The year 2020 marks Victor Quijada's return to the stage as a dancer in *Trenzado*, a piece that addresses the problem of being everywhere and nowhere at the same time.

Reckless Underdog, created in 2022, propels the company's achievements of the last twenty years to new heights. In a larger-than-life work, thirteen dancers come together in a choreography of three acts. Each part, a piece in itself, draws spectators into a unique, complex world through its distinctive scenography, music, and movement aesthetic.

RUBBERBAND's newest creation, **Second Chances**, invites Quijada and the audience to delve deep inside themselves, reflecting on origin, belonging and displacement, between universal questions and intimate, personal thoughts.

RUBBERBAND has co-produced **six films** choreographed by Quijada, who is also directing four of them: *Ever So Slightly - The Movie, Gravity of Center, Secret Service* and *Small Explosions That Are Yours to Keep. Gravity of Center* won the 2012 Les Enfants and Air Canada/Spafax awards at the RVCQ / Festival Prends ça court!. It also won Best Experimental Short Film and Best Cinematography in a Canadian Short Film at the CFC Worldwide Short Film Festival. *Hasta La Próxima*, shot in 2003, was a finalist in the short film category at the American Choreography Awards. Victor Quijada participated in the creation of three music videos, for the songs *Man I Used to Be* by k-os, *La Garde* by Alexandre Désilets and *Blue Wonderful* by Elton John.

Now well established, the company is the embodiment of Canadian artistic innovation in the United States, Europe, Mexico and Japan. RUBBERBAND is at the forefront of Montreal's contemporary dance community and is internationally recognized for its unique vision.

VICTOR QUIJADA

Since 2002, **Victor Quijada** has redefined the codes of breakdance with **RUBBERBAND**. Through his company and the **RUBBERBAND Method**, he has invigorated the Quebec choreographic milieu and paved the way for new creators. With over forty creations and collaborations in Canada and around the world, Quijada continues to develop in the midst of a prolific career.

Born to Mexican parents and raised in Los Angeles, Victor Quijada was first trained in the b-boying circles and hip hop clubs of his hometown. He joined Rudy Perez in 1994, moved to THARP! in New York in 1996 and worked with Les Ballets Tech in 1999 before arriving in Montreal in 2000, where he joined Les Grands Ballets Canadiens.

He founded RUBBERBAND in 2002 as he immersed himself in deconstructing the choreographic principles he had learned by combining them with the raw ideology of urban dance. His creations are imbued with a strong theatricality, the energy of improvisation, the codes of cinematic language and are sculpted by an incomparable precision of gesture.

Victor Quijada has created his own technique, the **RUBBERBAND Method**, made up of an electrifying vocabulary, combining the energy of **hip hop**, the refinement of **classical ballet** and the angular work of contemporary dance.

He has been teaching the RUBBERBAND Method worldwide for several years, through various workshops and courses for numerous companies, dance institutions and universities, but also on a recurring basis: his company's annual Montreal workshop is a good example.




As a guest choreographer, he has created new works with circus and dance companies. He has worked on several occasions with **Hubbard Street Dance Chicago**, **Pacific Northwest ballet** and **Scottish Dance Theatre**.

In terms of peer recognition, Quijada has been artist-in-residence at **Usine C** (2004) and **Place des Arts** (2007-2011), and has received numerous awards.

He is the recipient of the National Dance Award Best Modern Repertory (2003, USA), the Bonnie Bird North American Award (2003, England), the Peter Darrell Choreography Award (2003, England), the Canadian Dance Assembly International Outreach Award (2012, Canada), and two Princess Grace Foundation-USA awards (Choreography Fellowship, 2010; Work in Progress Residency, 2016), among others.

He has been invited to join the faculty of **USC Kaufman** in California, alongside William Forsythe from 2016-2020. He was awarded a second PGFA in 2016, in the form of a creative residency at the **Baryshnikov Arts Center** in New York.

In December 2017, Victor Quijada received the **award for Cultural Diversity** at the **Prix de la danse de Montréal** and was, in 2019, one of the **finalists for the 34th Grand Prix du Conseil des arts de Montréal** as well as among the four **finalists** for the 2019 **Charles-Biddle Prize**, instigated by Culture pour tous and the Ministère de l'Immigration, de la Francisation and Inclusion (MIFI). In 2024, Victor has been named **Fellow of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation** for his choreographic work, a prestigious recognition for all his achievements.

SECOND CHANCES

Victor Quijada's particularly intimate new work, Second Chances, is inspired by his experience in Los Angeles as a first-generation Mexican-American. Returning to the stage as a performer, Victor explores themes of identity and homeland. The show includes excerpts from *Trenzado*, which features a soundtrack by composer and DJ Jasper Gahunia, sampling traditional Mexican norteño music (corridos and ranchera).

In addition to Trenzado, this repertory program also includes Commissions Suite, a reconstruction of two works originally choreographed by Quijada for Hubbard Street Dance Chicago (Physikal Linguistiks) and Scottish Dance Theater (Second Coming). A soundtrack by Jasper Gahunia provides the landscape as seven performers navigate the chaos.

Second Chances invites Quijada and the audience to delve deep inside themselves, reflecting on origin, belonging and displacement, between universal questions and intimate, personal thoughts.

Trenzado is produced by RUBBERBAND and co-commissionned by Jacob's Pillow. RUBBERBAND benefitted from creation residencies offered by the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts | University of Illinois in Champagne/Urbana, New York Baryshnikov Arts Center with the RBDG Intensive Development Lab (IDL) supported by an Andrew W. Mellon Grant and Danse à la Carte.



RECKLESS UNDERDOG

2022

RUBBERBAND's new creation, Reckless Underdog, takes the company's work of the past twenty years further than ever before. Bigger than ever, the show features 12 dancers who come together in a three-act choreography. Each part offers a unique proposition; three distinct universes, in terms of stage space, aesthetic choices and music.

The first, **inspired by classical ballet**, takes place in a circumscribed and luminous environment where the rules of *pas de deux* are redefined. The second, more experimental, **distorts certain theatrical codes** within a colored space and confronts the bodies with an abstract and minimal approach to movement. The last one **deconstructs the practice of the** *break cypher*, in a dark, oppressive, but festive atmosphere.

For **Victor Quijada**, Artistic Director and Choreographer, a new era is opening for the company. *Reckless Underdog* promises to take us on a lyrical and figurative dissection of movement, boldly exploring the limits of time and space.

TRENZADO

2020

Trenzado marks Victor Quijada's return to the stage. With modesty, in a poetic way, this creation questions what lies behind the fact of being everywhere and nowhere at the same time. With Trenzado, Victor Quijada, the American citizen of Mexican descent turned Canadian choreographer, revisits his past with a certain nostalgia in order to propel his creative language even further. Built around the themes of "roots", "borders", "homeland" and "loss", the piece explores the physical and emotional limits we face when we are uprooted from our surroundings, when ties are broken and we have to rebuild and redefine ourselves. The play also addresses the hope that comes with starting over. True to the emotional genesis of Quijada, the production is haunted by Mexican norteño music (corrido and ranchera) here deconstructed and reworked by composer Jasper Gahunia.

Trenzado is produced by RUBBERBAND in co-production with Jacob's Pillow. RUBBERBAND has benefited from creative residencies at the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts | University of Illinois at Champagne/Urbana, the Baryshnikov Arts Center in New York, funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Grant, and Dance for Life, funded by the National Arts Centre. Mellon Grant and Danse à la Carte. Ever So Slightly looks at the behavioural mechanisms and reflexes we develop in the face of the constant stream of nuisances bombarding our daily lives.


If most humans carry a desire for calm and resilience, how do we make our way to a zone where noise and aggression no longer have a place? Capable of **delicacy**, **finesse**, **brutality** and **high acrobatics**, the choreographer, with his RUBBERBAND Method mastered by an athletic group, tackles this time the energy contained in urgency, revolt and escape. Surrounded by a team made up of new collaborators in addition to certain key creators, nourished by new performers with a diverse background, RUBBERBAND shifts into fourth gear; built on a dramaturgical framework that first clears the excessive, and that seeks a balance between the oppositions that inhabit us (that cohabit...), Vraiment doucement is a quest for a possible tranquility.

CITY THREAD

2017

Forty dancers and as many participants as the Esplanade of Place des Arts can accommodate joined in the first version of an outdoor multidisciplinary performance work in which dance, music, and architecture came together. *City Thread* is designed to allow spectators to choose one of the groups of dancers and follow along on pre-determined paths, guided by a dedicated smart-phone application.

As **hundreds of spectators actively participate in the performance**, each one of them enjoys an individualized experience through their headphones, thanks to a unique soundtrack that unfolds as they wind their way around the public space and through the dancers. Simultaneously, multiple private encounters occur at random, as the performance is in continual motion.

The premiere of City Thread, part of the **celebrations of Montreal's 375th anniversary**, took place in August 2017 on the Esplanade of Place des Arts.

With both humorous and serious moments, *Vic's Mix* is a kind of "best of" spanning the immense creative territory explored by Quijada, extracting jewels from the choreographer's repertoire.

In a remix of his own work, orchestrating the **clash between urban pop and classical composition**. Quijada goes further in his experiments defying notions of theatricality and audience expectations, while making sure that each body gravitating onstage in the highly athletic segments exemplifies the **RUBBERBAND Method**.
